It has been an exciting program year. We appreciate your interest and support as we strive to be a model of excellence for early childhood development and family support.







Demographics of Families & Children Served





#### **Family Engagement**

Family Engagement occurs in multiple settings and systems where Mid Florida Community Services Head Start families and children interact, learn, and play. Mid Florida Community Services, Inc. Head Start coordinates to promote and reinforce continuity of care, build on existing parent engagement efforts in the community, and extend reach through existing services and resources. Each year families are given the opportunity to participate in parent committees, monthly parent meetings, parent planned activities, parent trainings and serve on policy council.

#### **Parent Success Stories**

Nanette Jackson received her Associates Degree in Medical Administrative Assistant. Nanette is a single mother of four children and was inspired to go back to school from the guidance of her family advocate. Nanette is still continuing to accomplish her goals.

Roxaly Pizarro is a single mother of one, who enrolled her child at our Hernando County Head Start program. Roxaly was very nervous at first, that her only child would be going to school and no longer in her watch throughout the day. To settle her nerves, family advocate Martha Lawson invited Roxaly to observe in the classroom and to become a volunteer. Roxaly immediately seized the opportunity. Our Child Development Specialist immediately took notice to Roxaly's ability working with children and her nurturing nature. Our extended day care program was in need of assistance and MFCS Child Development specialist felt she had already found the perfect candidate. Roxaly was hired as a part time extended day staff for our program.





# Efforts to Prepare Children for Kindergarten

Our Head Start program promotes wellness of all children throughout the year. Children are assessed, receive services as needed, and show increases in physical health and knowledge of wellness, gross and fine motor skill development, social/emotional development, language and communication, and cognitive skills.




